This year, the Foundation hosted a range of interactive online and face to face workshops, State and Territory specific forums, and webinars across Australia. We were proud to partner with and incorporate the expertise of therapeutic leaders, experts and research scholars in the area of harmful sexual behaviour and build great professional networks.

Ensuring that help and advice on typical sexual development and harmful sexual behaviour is available for parents and carers will be a key focus for the program going forward. With a parent and carer specific webinar held in December, we have already started this crucial and valuable work.

We look forward to 2022 being another great opportunity to continue to develop Australia's child safety awareness and keep important conversations progressing.

### Have a chat about child safety


This year's Day for Daniel resource is our new Child Safety Chatterbox.
