# Keeping kids safe!

### Day for Daniel

Australia's largest and most successful child safety awareness day held annually on the last Friday of October.

The Day for Daniel keeps getting bigger and better every year.

Record numbers of schools registered to participate in Day for Daniel this year with almost 2,500 schools across Australia wearing red, educating and donating.

All schools were encouraged to teach children to *Recognise*, *React* and *Report* in unsafe situations. The Foundation provided educational resources free of charge to assist schools in educating their students. Each year, new material is produced to keep the educational component new and interesting.

This year videos and activities were developed on Respectful Relationships and were included in the Keeping Kids Safe Resource Kit which was sent free of charge to every school, business and community group which registered to participate in Day for Daniel. Approximately 4,000 kits were distributed.

Federal Parliament was involved again this year, with most members of parliament wearing our red badges and red ribbons in Parliament on October 20th. Thank you Mr Ted O'Brien MP for organising this initiative on behalf of the Foundation. Schools and Businesses from across Australia participated in Day for Daniel. Following are a few stories from those who participated.

**Normanton State School** in far north Queensland held a Walk to the Normanton PCYC with as many school children wearing red and carrying Day for Daniel balloons. Once everyone reached the PCYC, a free BBQ was held for participants and children were free to play in the water park. The walk was open to the whole community.

At **Bulahdelah Central School** in New South Wales, they invited a local police officer along to talk to the students about safety issues and the importance of safe behaviours.

Students at **Moorak Primary School** in South Australia wore red and lined the school fence with red balloons and a sign in memory of Daniel

La Salle Academy in Lithgow, NSW had a great fundraising day! They are a very small school with less than 300 students. The students and staff were asked to 'wear something red' in support of the Daniel Morcombe Foundation, and to donate a gold coin.

Schools, businesses and libraries around the **Bega Valley** participated in the event by wearing red. Year 6 pupils who use social media said in order to stay safe it was important to not give away any private information online, and not become

friends with someone online whom you do not know. Students held up their hands for photographs. The five fingers of their hands represented five people to talk to if they are in trouble.

Sacred Heart Primary in Victoria invited a guest speaker Sergeant Brent Yearwood to speak to the students about safety in the community as well as online. The main event on the day included a raffle with prizes donated from local businesses.

Bayswater Police in Western Australia visited Hillcrest Primary School to present child safety information at an assembly and had worked with Principal Dan Bralic to promote the event. Bayswater Police Officer-incharge Sen Sgt John Waghorn praised WA Police and Schools that took part. "It was an outstanding commitment by local schools and police who took time out from their normal responsibilities to assist in promoting child safety"

In what has become a much cherished Ferny Grove tradition, students walked from **Ferny Grove State School** to the High School - a sea of red in support of the Daniel Morcombe Foundation and their message of safety for young people.



## Wrap-up of our school visits

### It's a Wrap! School presentations have now finished for 2016.

As part of their role as Queensland Child Safety Ambassadors with the QLD Department of Education and Training, Bruce and Denise visited students from 56 schools from all over Queensland. They travelled and presented as far south as the Gold Coast and as far north as Thursday Island. They visited schools as remote as Doomadgee, Weipa, Burketown and Builyan in the Boyne Valley.



Denise said: "My most memorable schools were definitely on Thursday Island as the experience was rich in culture. They danced and sang for us and showed us some of their traditional ways which we really enjoyed. The children were also very attentive at the school presentations".

She has fond memories of Gracemere State School because the teachers were so helpful to the students with breakfast clubs and additional support as required.

Denise remembers Koumala State School as they flew to Rockhampton collected Big Red, drove 3 hours and arrived at 1 minute to 2pm for a 2pm presentation. They have never been late yet!

St Francis Xavier at Runaway Bay had an impressive Grass Add of the Daniel Morcombe Foundation Logo. The biggest audience was at Northpine Christian College with 831 students in attendance at the presentation.



The most impressive entrance was MacGregor State School who made a human tunnel for our grand entrance and called it the Walk of Honour.

Denise says "Doing the School Presentations is the most enjoyable part of my work at the Foundation". Bruce and Denise are looking forward to more presentations in 2017.

There is already a waiting list for school presentations up to 2018.

### Tweed to the Territory

For the second year in a row, the Australian Federal Police (AFP) took command of 'Big Red' and hit the road through regional NSW, providing child safety messages to over 4000 students in the lead up to Day for Daniel.

Following the 2015 Canberra to Pambula tour, titled 'Capital to the Coast', the 2016 tour comprised a two week journey from Tweed Heads in Northern NSW, through regional NSW and onwards to Canberra for 'Day for Daniel'. Aptly titled the 'Tweed to the Territory' tour, regional schools were provided the opportunity to hear the ever important Daniel Morcombe Foundation's messaging of recognising, reacting, and reporting danger.

The tour team, comprising of staff from the AFP's National Missing Persons Coordination Centre and the Cyber and Child Safety team, visited the areas of Tweed Heads, Richmond North, South Penrith, Hobartville, Bilpin, Lithgow, Bathurst, Blayney, Goulburn, Sutton, Holmwood and Murrumburrah.

Not to leave out the adults, the AFP's 'Think-U-Know' (TuK) evidence based cyber safety presentations were provided to parents, carers and teachers. The presentations focused on what young people SAY, SEE and DO online and



discussed current online challenges of sexting, cyberbullying, grooming and privacy.

Following the tours conclusion in Canberra on 'Day for Daniel', the team now look forward to next year's adventure and where it will take Big Red.

Kay was followed by Mr Ted O'Brien who delivered a message from the Prime Minister and then The Hon Mick de Brenni who delivered a message from the Premier of Queensland. Denise and Bruce then addressed the excited crowd. Denise said "Bruce and I are now grandparents. For us this is a wonderful experience. Winston Daniel George Morcombe and his parents Bradley and Anna join us here today. Our commitment to the Foundation named in an uncle Winston will never know has made our work even more important. It is now personal."

Bruce said: 'It is time to make a stand. Predators are online now talking to our kids. Some will have a criminal record and some won't. The greatest defence alerting us of this danger and the greatest deterrent stopping abusers of our kids is to have a nationally coordinated, well

managed, Public Accessible Sex Offenders Website. Bruce then introduced Senator Derryn Hinch to speak about Daniels Law. After the speeches concluded the Walk commenced. It was time to complete the Walk Daniel never got to do. Bruce, Denise, Anna, Brad, Winston and Senator Hinch burst through the banner first closely followed by the rest of the VIP's and walkers.

A Police car and motorbike waited at the top of the ramp ready to escort the Walkers through the car park up the school entry road onto the footpath. There was a string of red all away along the Woombye - Palmwoods Road to Briggs Park. At the finish line there were ice blocks, cold drinks, bacon and egg burgers, doughnuts, a sausage sizzle, face painting, jumping castle, jump zone, games and music. Media were out in force helping to spread our child safety messages nationally and locally.

A great morning was had by all and everyone in attendance helped spread our very important child safety messages. We must thank the many volunteers, organisers, VIP's, walkers and sponsors who all contributed to a magnificent event. In particular we thank the Queensland Police Service, Rapid Response Team, The Department of Community Services Volunteers, Sunshine Coast Council, Assist First Aid and TAFE East Coast.
