

Getting help to grow Australia's **Biggest Child Safety Lesson**

Help-seeking was the theme of this year's Australia's Biggest Child Safety Lesson (ABCSL) for 4 to 7 year olds and 8 to 12 year olds.









Asking for help can be tough. This year, the Foundation asked children for help in developing the resources. Children from Laidley District State School told us what makes them feel unsafe and how they like to learn.

Their feedback led to the development of two fantastic new videos. The early years and junior primary video is an animation which uses the story of Little Red Riding Hood to reinforce the importance of talking to a safety helper; the upper primary resource uses an upbeat news format to heroise reporting.

Livestreamed to a guarter of a million children in classrooms, early learning centres and remote learning across Australia on Tuesday 7 September, ABCSL has cemented its place as an important part of National Child Protection Week. Bruce and Denise joined the students and staff at Laidley for the livestream as children saw their feedback come to life.

As more responses trickle in from around the country, the Daniel Morcombe Foundation would like to thank everyone who helped to make ABCSL possible. five tips

to support children during Covid-19 lockdowns

Reassure

Let children know that it's normal to be worried. Talk about their safety and the safety of their loved ones, remind them that you will get through this together and this isn't going to last forever.

Keep routines

As much as possible, try to retain predictable routines like sleeping, eating, learning, and playing.

Prioritise quality time

Make sure that you are making time each day to have fun together. Spend quality time together playing, reading, going outdoors.

Follow up on their feelings

Check in to see how they are feeling and do this regularly. Offer opportunities for children to ask questions, talk about what's going on, and support their feelings.

Encourage open communication

Let children know that they can talk to you about anything that makes them feel scared. sad or worried. Talk through these feeling and draw focus on positive aspects of the lockdown experience.
