Australia's Biggest Child Safety Lesson

Australia's Biggest Child Safety Lesson (ABCSL) 2022 was all about boundaries and body parts! This year saw our biggest lesson yet with over 300,000 children across Australia joining in to watch ABCSL live during National Child Protection Week.

ABCSL explored personal safety concepts and removed the secrecy, stigma and mystery around private body parts while teaching children about body ownership.

Over 2,896 schools and early learning centres registered to watch ABCSL and we were thrilled to launch the lessons at Mount Gravatt State School as they were live-streamed across Australia.

Mount Gravatt State School students were members of the Child Advisory Group that were consulted at each step along the way in the content creation and production of the Early Years and Junior Primary lessons. They also played the roles of Junior Journalists, interviewing some of the Brisbane Lions AFL players about boundaries and were excited to see themselves on the big screen.

The lessons make teaching personal safety easy, and the Daniel Morcombe Foundation would like to thank everyone involved in developing ABCSL. Both videos, accompanying lesson plans and resources are available at DanielMorcombe.com.au

The Foundation was lucky to have the opportunity to participate in many Child Protection Week activities and events across Australia.





August saw Bruce and Denise set off in Big Red on a Kids Safe Tour commencing with Child Safety presentations to schools in Canberra.

Radford College's year 5 and 6 students were attentive and eager to hear about being safe in the real and online world, as were the year 3 to 6 students at Canberra Girls Grammar. From Canberra, Bruce and Denise travelled across the state to St Mary's in Maffra in Victoria before heading up to the Riverina area of New South Wales where they presented to students from nine local schools the critical safety messages that help kids to recognise, react and report!

Education Resources

Our Education team have been busy working on new choose your own adventure (CYOA) style animation resources to be used with Day for Daniel activities. The CYOA style affords young people to make thought-provoking decisions, based on 'real-life' situations in a safe environment. This facilitates experiential learning moments rather than a passive watching experience. We have been consulting with young people from Refocus, to inform the scenarios and characters used in the animation.

We are excited to be working with Dr Danielle Harris and David Bartlett from Griffith University who will evaluate the effectiveness of this new resource.





Changing Futures

Our Changing Futures team has had a busy few months delivering workshops and forums in Ngunnawal/Canberra, Turrbul and Juggerra/Brisbane, Kaurna/Adelaide and Larrakia/Darwin.

It has been a privilege to co-host our forums with the Children's Commissioner from each state and territory and to have the National Office of Child Safety present on the National strategy. We were joined by two keynote speakers, Associate Professor Elspeth McInnes AM and Dr Lesley-Anne Ey, who delivered findings from their research 'Parents knowledge, views and experiences of service responses to children's harmful sexual behaviours'.

The Changing Futures webinar series saw Miranda Bain, Director of Therapy Services at Act for Kids presenting an informative and thoughtful webinar titled 'Looking in before looking out – our values and harmful sexual behaviour.' We also saw a panel of presenters from QLD Police Child Abuse and Sexual Crime Group (Argos) present on the role QLD police plays in dealing with harmful sexual behaviours. Our impact

The Daniel Morcombe Foundation is committed to assisting child victims of crime on their journey to recovery.

We have recently been able to:

- Assist children and young people by providing funds for the development of a Courage Kit for young children who are required to give evidence in court matters
- Provide a laptop for a 15 year old girl to continue their studies and were thrilled to hear that they had recently won a poetry competition
- Provide registration fee funds for a 15 year old boy to represent Australia in Rugby League
- Self-defence classes for a 14 year old boy
- Trauma-informed tutoring for a 10-year-old sibling of a murdered child
- Provide a therapeutic horse riding camp for a 12 year old girl.

Top 5 Safety tips

Talking to children about personal boundaries and teaching them to tell a safety helper if someone tries to cross a boundary is very important.

Be alert to any adult who:

- Doesn't respect your child's boundaries or listens when they say 'No'
- 2. Is excessively affectionate and ignores your child's signs of discomfort
- 3. Exposes your child to inappropriate content
- Makes your child feel more special than others
- 5. Gives surprise gifts to your child.

Remind your child that they are the boss of their own body and that they can say 'No!' to anything that makes them feel uncomfortable.
