The key takeaway from Phil's impactful speech was the "importance of giving children the educational tools and resources in keeping them safe. It is also vitally important for a child to be believed and supported when they report any form of sexual abuse, it is most important for adults to act on it and report it to the police".

ACMS Study Launch

Bruce, Denise and members of our Bright Futures team attended the official launch of the Australian Child Maltreatment Study. The study shows that 62% of Australians over 16 have reported experiencing being abused, neglected, or exposed to domestic violence as children.

The report highlights that Australia must invest

significant funding into (primary) prevention of child maltreatment and abuse as an immediate priority, and stop the abuse before it starts.





The Daniel Morcombe Foundation is proud to announce the Launch and first Forum of the Bright Futures program in Queensland on 13 June 2023.

Following on from the successful Changing Futures project, Bright Futures is a national education and training project aiming to reduce and prevent child sexual abuse. Designed for professionals, parents and carers, Bright Futures focuses on the issues of harmful sexual behaviours, child sexual exploitation and technology assisted harmful sexual behaviours.

Bright Futures will be launched this year in Brisbane by our Founders, Bruce and Denise Morcombe and Professor Simon Hackett from Durham University's Department of Sociology. Professor Hackett's research with children and young people with harmful sexual behaviour is internationally recognised and has transformed policy and practice across the globe.

Professor Hackett will be a special keynote speaker as part of the Forum following the launch, and will be joined by experts discussing preventing, identifying and responding to harmful sexual behaviours.

Top 5 Safety tips

How can I protect my child when they are online?

- 1. Share their online world. Get involved in what your child is doing online.
- 2. Make their accounts private. Check the settings on all platforms.
- 3. Sit together and review their friends and followers.
- Qpen up conversation. Let your child know that they can come to you about anything that is troubling them online.
- 5. Empower them to block and report anyone who makes them feel unsafe. They are always allowed to say no to anyone that makes them feel unsafe.
