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Australia's Biggest Child Safety Lesson

Over 500,000 Australian students from more than 3,300 early learning centres, schools, home schools and households watched Australia's Biggest Child Safety Lesson (ABCSL) live stream on Tuesday 5 September. The lessons educated children about consent, including the message of 'My body, my choice,' and provided strategies for seeking, giving, or denying consent.

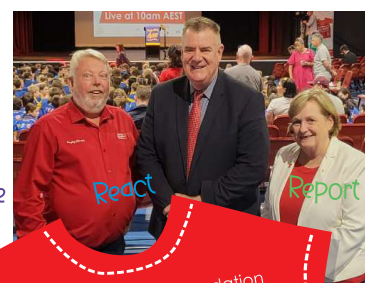
The upper lesson was launched at Ferny Grove State School where over 400 students were joined by Mark Furner MP for Ferny Grove, Christine Loos and Rosie Robinson from Queensland Department of Education, Luke Twyford the Chief Executive and Principal Commissioner at Queensland Family and Child Commission, Trending Media Australia and Upshot Studios who produced the lessons for the Foundation.

ABCSL lower animated lesson follows junior news reporters as they travel around Australia with Bruce and Denise to learn about consent. ABCSL upper lesson uses a talk show game format to incorporate realistic scenarios to teach upper primary children about consent.

Top 4 Safety tips

Communicating About Consent

1. Respectful communication about consent can help children assert their right to comfort and safety.
2. Conversations around consent should be ongoing and can be weaved into everyday scenarios. For example, "Do you want a hug goodbye today? We could also wave or high-five."
3. Always ask for and respect consent. Observe the person's response and be aware that it can change. Look for an enthusiastic "yes".
4. If someone crosses your boundaries without consent, seek help from a safety helper.
